Bloomfield currently is home to a number of significant non-agricultural businesses. For the first 200 years of Bloomfield's existence as Wintonbury Parish (before 1835), and then as a municipality, most town land was devoted to agricultural pursuits. Local Historian and Vice President of the Wintonbury Historical Society, Fred Hesketh will present tales relating to those who toiled on Bloomfield farms in those days and their place in both the town and the state.

Bloomfield and the Civil War by Fred Hesketh

The union army needed troops to fight the Civil War. There was no draft at the time, so the military relied on volunteers to fill its ranks. A call went out to all the towns in New England to support the war by encouraging men to enlist. Bloomfield Connecticut responded by offering a cash incentive bounty to its residents who enlisted. The bounty proved to be a strong incentive—perhaps too strong in some cases.

Many Bloomfield citizens fought in the Civil War. Some were wounded. Some died in battle. Some died of disease or other non-combat causes. Some were captured. Some deserted.

The Wintonbury Historical Society has documented the story of the impact of the war on Bloomfield and the men from Bloomfield who fought in the Civil War, as well as those men who fought and claimed to live in Bloomfield—but didn't.
