# Flea Market/Tag & Bake Sale




September 24th (Rain or Shine) 8 a.m. - 3 p.m. at the Old Farm School (corner Park & School Streets)

#### Classes are in Session at the Old Farm School

Old Farm School has been closed, most of the summer, due to the re-pointing - However, would like to offer a report from Mary Murray, Old Farm School chair, as an example of how the school can be used.

On Saturday May 14th, Bloomfield's three elementary schools held a Fun and Fitness walk which originated from the Old Farm School. The students filed in to the classroom, took their seats and sat attentively as they learned what it would have been like to attend school in 1796. They were very inquisitive about such important things as the bathroom and recess. Of course the highlight of the school day was ringing the bell. Some students even stated that they wanted to attend school here. We had approximately 100 teachers, parents and students on our opening weekend, what a terrific way to start the season.
